

Introduction

The Royal Life Saving Society was formed in London in 1891 to address the appalling loss of life to drowning in the River Thames. Stimulating interest by public lectures, demonstrations and competitions, word spread quickly and key people, including members of the Royal Family, became supporters. Overseas tours quickly spread the enthusiasm for swimming and lifesaving skills and led to the formation of lifesaving organisations and branches of the Society.

The Royal Life Saving Society is a pan Commonwealth organisation, accredited to The Commonwealth, recognised by the Commonwealth Games Federation and now represented in thirty three countries. The impact of the Society, through the work of its Members, extends still further into other Commonwealth and non-Commonwealth countries.





The Society has enjoyed Royal Patronage since 1902 when King Edward VII agreed to support it. Renewed from monarch to monarch, the role of Patron was graciously granted by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in June 1952.

The Society has been governed by a Royal Charter since 1924; Her Majesty has granted two Supplementary Charters in 1960 and 2018. Being able to display the name "Royal" as part of our title bestows rank and status on the organisation and earmarks the Society as a respected association.

Long before she became Queen, Her Majesty had already made significant contributions to the Society, taking part in competitions, achieving proficiency awards which in turn led to significant media coverage and becoming a Vice President of the Society.







Throughout her reign, the Society's members throughout the Commonwealth have benefitted from the support of Her Majesty's representatives who have hosted investitures and other events and, in many countries, acted as in-country Patrons.



Highlights

A timeline of Her Majesty's achievements and support of the Royal Life Saving Society



1937 Festival of Youth

On 3rd July 1937, a Festival of Youth was held at the Empire Stadium, Wembley in the presence of Their Majesties the King and Queen and Their Royal Highnesses Princess Elizabeth and Princess Margaret.

The Society presented a detachment of representatives from all parts of England and from a number of Life Guard Clubs. Perhaps this inspired Her Royal Highness, leading to her lifelong interest in the Society.

1937 Elementary Award

Under the instruction of Miss Amy Daly, a member of the Central Executive, Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth passed the Elementary Certificate examination for lifesaving in 1937. The examiner was Miss M J McConnell and the examination form recorded that "Her Royal Highness carried out the land drill very smartly, worked well in the water and is a strong and graceful swimmer".





1938 Intermediate Award

In 1938, again under the instruction of Miss Amy Daly, Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth was successful in the second of the Society's tests, that for the Intermediate Certificate. The Society's Chief Secretary, Captain Alwyn Briscoe, was the examiner and expressed the view that the land drills and work in the water were carried out exceedingly well.

1939 Lifesaving Competition

In June 1939, at the Bath Club, Dover Street. London, HRH Princess Elizabeth and HRH Princess Margaret competed in the Club's annual Women's and Children's competitions. This was described as their first appearance in a competition. The events included one length breast stroke, judged for style; one width backstoke, judged for style; one width lifesaving in which competitors had to rescue an apparently drowning person, struggling slightly; and a dive from the side of the bath. Princess Elizabeth won the Children's Challenge Shield Competition for girls over nine and under fourteen against ten other competitors with a score of 35 points out of a possible 40. Her Majesty The Queen was in attendance and presented the prizes.



1941 Junior Respiration Award

The insignia was a celluloid pin badge, with a Certificate of Ownership. The examination fee was 1 shilling.

Candidates had to demonstrate:

- With others, a drill based on the Society's military style training methods followed by a demonstration of the Schafer method of manual respiration for a continuous period of at least five minutes followed by steps for the promotion of circulation
- Rhythmic working when the casualty is being covered to promote warmth; taking over from another operator; turning the patient from face upwards to face downwards

In addition, candidates had to answer questions to show their understanding of the elementary principles of respiration and circulation of the blood and the reasons for the movements in the Schafer Method




1941 Junior Artificial Respiration Award

In 1941, the Society introduced an artificial respiration instruction to children over the age of 14 years. Whilst they could not be expected to take an active part during air raids or, in fact, immediately after, it was considered that a sound knowledge of Artificial Respiration would be helpful in the school or in the home. Therefore a Junior Artificial Respiration examination was instituted, and a cellulose coat badge together with a Certificate of Ownership was prepared as the award for Juniors. This information was conveyed to Her Majesty the Queen by Miss Amy Daly. Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth on hearing of it expressed her desire to become the first successful candidate to pass this new examination. This desire was realised in February that year when she presented herself for examination. The report of the examiners was that Her Royal Highness proved herself to be extremely efficient. Such an example created great enthusiasm among the younger generation.

1944 Vice Patron

In 1944, Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth, with the permission of His Majesty, graciously consented to become the Society's Vice Patron.





1951 Diamond Jubilee AGM

In 1951 the Society celebrated its 60th Anniversary. Earl Mountbatten had decided to inaugurate an annual Medal for the bravest rescue of the year. Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth, Duchess of Edinburgh, as Vice Patron, accompanied by Earl Mountbatten and the Countess Mountbatten, honoured the Society by attending the Diamond Jubilee Annual Council Meeting on 3rd June. Her Royal Highness unveiled the Mountbatten Life Savers' Panel and presented Insignias of Honour to honorary workers from all parts of the Empire in recognition of their valuable services in the interests of Life Saving.

1952 Patronage

On 3rd June 1952, Her Majesty honoured the Society by granting it Her Patronage in succession to her late father King George VI.



1954 Visit to Australia

While on a visit to Australia in 1954, Her Majesty and His Royal Highness Prince Philip attended a surf carnival at Bondi Beach.

On 2nd March, the Federal President, Mr P.E. Joske and the Federal President, Mr E.A. Pleydell of RLSS were called to Government House, Melbourne and were presented to Her Majesty by His Excellency, the Governor of Victoria, Sir Dallas Brooks. During the audience, the Queen showed great knowledge of the work of the Society in Australia and made the request that her congratulations and thanks for the wonderful work they were doing be conveyed to all lifesavers throughout the Commonwealth.



1960 Supplemental Royal Charter

In 1960 Her Majesty approved the granting of a Supplemental Royal Charter. This was the first major governance change since 1924 and created self-governing branches in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, South Africa and the United Kingdom under the stewardship of the Commonwealth Council.

1961 First Commonwealth Conference

Following the granting of the Supplemental Royal Charter, the Society held its first Commonwealth Conference. By permission of Her Majesty, the opening ceremony was held in St James Palace, where the Conference was formally declared open by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, The Queen Mother. Following the opening of the Conference, members of the Commonwealth Council, the delegates and representative members of the Society were honoured to be entertained by Her Majesty The Queen and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh at a sherry party in Buckingham Palace, during which Her Majesty graciously accepted from Earl Mountbatten, as Grand President, the Patron's Badge of the

Society in gold and enamel.



1963 Visit to New Zealand

During a visit to New Zealand in 1963, Her Majesty and His Royal Highness Prince Philip attended a Royal Surf Carnival in Tauranga and met representatives of the Society. In Christchurch, they invited Mr G. D. Griffiths, the President of RLSS New Zealand, to a private luncheon, and, prior to the meal, spoke with him for some time on matters pertaining to the affairs of the Society.

The work of the Society has again been aided by a very pleasant summer that encouraged an increasing interest in all aquatic activities. OUR ROYAL VISITORS In February, all New Zealanders were delighted to have with them Her Majesty the Queen and Prince Philip. Although brief, the visit was most successful, being informal, and was hailed by all as a desirable type, but it must have been streamous for the visitors. Her Majesty and Prince Philip attended a Royal Surf. Carmival at Tauranga where Inter-Provincial events were contested while they were present. Mr. S. B. Mason, President of the New Zealand Surf Life Saving Association, Vice-President of The Royal Life Saving Association, Vice-President of The Royal Life Saving Mosciety, New Zealand, answered Her Majesty's queries on the finer points of the resuscitation and rescue events with which our Royal Patron was familiar of the New Zealand Surf Life Saving Association, Vice-President of The Royal Life Saving Assoc



1964 Use of St Edward's Crown

Following a suggestion made at a meeting of the Council of the Royal Life Saving Society at which he was present, the Grand President, with the unanimous support of the Commonwealth Council, sought the Queen's permission to add a Royal Crown to the badge of the Society. Her Majesty was graciously pleased to approve the use of the St Edward's Crown with the badge used by the Commonwealth Council.


1966 Commonwealth Conference

The Second Quinquennial Commonwealth Conference of the Royal Life Saving Society was opened at St James Palace on the afternoon of 18th July 1966 by Her Royal Highness Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowden. That evening Her Majesty The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh honoured the Society by giving a reception at Buckingham Palace.



1970 Visit to New Zealand

In 1970 Her Majesty hosted a small dinner party on board HMS Britannia in Christchurch, New Zealand and invited members of Royal Life Saving New Zealand.



1971 Commonwealth Conference

The Third Quinquennial Conference was held in London and opened by Her Royal Highness Princess Alexandra at Marlborough House. The Conference included a reception at Buckingham Palace hosted by Her Majesty and His Royal Highness Prince Philip.

1975 Visit to Hong Kong

In May 1975 Her Majesty and HRH Prince Philip visited Hong Kong and toured Morse Park Swimming Pool and watched a series of lifesaving demonstrations by members of the Hong Kong branch and the Children's Swimming Programmes.



1976 Commonwealth Conference

The Fourth Quinquennial Commonwealth Conference was opened on the 17th May 1976 at St James Palace by the Grand President of RLSS, Her Royal Highness Princess Alexandra, the Honourable Mrs Angus Ogilvy.

On the following evening, as a practical demonstration of her continued active patronage of the Society, Her Majesty The Queen held a reception at Buckingham Palace for the Conference delegates and special invited guests.

1977 Silver Jubilee

As part of the Silver Jubilee Tour, Her Majesty visited Tasmania and, at Hobart, was hosted by the Lord Mayor, Mr Doug Plaister. Mr Plaister was a key official in the RLSS Tasmania Branch and a member of the RLSS Australia Board of Trustees.





1981 Commonwealth Conference

The Fifth Commonwealth Quinquennial Conference was held in London in 1981. Her Majesty and His Royal Highness Prince Philip hosted delegates at a reception at Buckingham Palace.

1983 Unveiling Mountbatten Statue

In 1983, Her Majesty unveiled the Mountbatten Statue at Horse Guards Parade, London. Besides being a member of the Royal Family, a distinguished military leader and the last Vice-Roy of India, Earl Mountbatten was successively President, Grand President and Honorary Grand President of the Royal Life Saving Society between 1945 and 1979.





1986 RLSSA UK Tour

In May 1986, the touring team from RLSS Australia arrived at Birmingham to commence a month long tour of the UK. This entailed visits to many regions, four separate competitions, many civic and cultural events and culminated in a visit to Buckingham Palace and a presentation to Her Majesty, HRH Prince Philip and HRH Prince Michael.

1986 Commonwealth Conference

The Sixth Commonwealth Quinquennial Conference was held in London in 1981. Her Majesty and His Royal Highness Prince Philip hosted delegates at a reception at Buckingham Palace.

During the Reception, Her Majesty presented the King Edward VII Cup to Sir Basil Osborne, President RLSS Australia, who received it on behalf of George W.H. Turnbull OAM of Australia.



1991 Centenary Commonwealth Conference

The Centenary Commonwealth Quinquennial Conference was held in London in 1991. Her Majesty and His Royal Highness Prince Philip hosted delegates at a reception at Buckingham Palace. During the Reception, Her Majesty presented the King Edward VII Cup to J. Allen Lee, President RLSS New Zealand, who received it on behalf of Stuart E. Nicol QSO, MBE of New Zealand.

1992 RLSS UK Life Support Presentation

In 1992, the Royal Anniversary Challenge to find the most innovative community based projects awarded a Gold Medal to RLSS UK for its Life Support Campaign. The medal was awarded jointly to the National Federation of Women's Institutes and was presented by Her Majesty at a ceremony held in St James's Palace on 26th November. Her Majesty praised the campaign in particular for its partnership between two voluntary organisations in the service of the community.

1992 Visit to Malta

During a State visit to Malta to inaugurate the Siege Bell Memorial in Valletta, members of RLSS Malta were invited to meet with Your Majesty.





1996 Commonwealth Conference

The 8th Commonwealth Quinquennial Conference was held in Stratford on Avon in 1996. Her Majesty and His Royal Highness Prince Philip hosted delegates at a reception at Buckingham Palace.

1996 Presentation of King Edward VII Cup

At the Buckingham Palace Reception, Her Majesty presented the King Edward VII Cup to Brian Morrissey OBE, QPM the Honorary President of RLSS United Kingdom.




1996 Ascot Race Day

In 2001 I was awarded the King Edward VII Cup by Her Majesty at Buckingham Palace, a momentous occasion that brought pride and joy to the Malaysian delegation that witnessed the ceremony. Her Majesty's Golden Jubilee was celebrated throughout the Commonwealth in a variety of ways. For example, RLSS UK launched a series of Golden Jubilee Awards. The Canadian Government provided Golden Jubilee Medals to organisations, including the Life Saving Society, Canada to award to Canadians who had made outstanding and exemplary contributions to their communities or to Canada as a whole.

2006 Presentation of King Edward VII Cup

At a private audience held at Buckingham Palace in October 2006, Her Majesty presented the King Edward VII Cup to Dr Anthony Handley the Chief Medical Advisor to RLSS United Kingdom.


2007 Presentation to markDiamond Wedding Anniversary

2016 125th Anniversary Reception

Her Majesty also presented the Society's Mountbatten Medal to Zak Dominique of St Lucia and the Russell Medal to Tyler Bailer of Canada.

2016 Patron's Lunch

In June 2016, Society volunteers and guests attended The Patron's Lunch, a huge picnic in The Mall, celebrating Her Majesty's patronage of charities and organisations in the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth - what a memorable day!

Following the Patron's Lunch, the Society received a gift of £2,500 from the Patron's Fund, which was used towards running Regional Development Workshops in Africa, Asia Pacific and the Caribbean.









2018 Supplemental Royal Charter

In 2018, Her Majesty granted a Supplemental Royal Charter to the Society. This built on the provisions of the 1960 Supplemental Charter and modernised the governance of the Society.

2021 Virtual Presentation of King Edward VII Cup

In May 2021, during the Covid-19 pandemic, Her Majesty graciously presented the King Edward VII Cup to Dr Stephen Beerman of Canada in a virtual ceremony. Two previous Russell Medal recipients, Tanner Gorille from South Africa and Sarah Downs from the UK also joined the presentation. During the call, Her Majesty spoke of her own experiences of taking the Society's Awards when she was younger.

2022 Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

To mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee as our Patron, the Society developed a commemorative Certificate which Member Organisations could award for attendance at a drowning prevention or lifesaving event held during 2022. Kenya Lifesaving Federation has linked this to their competition events and RLSS UK have developed a special award reflecting the elements of the awards taken by Her Majesty in her youth. In this way, Her Majesty's influence continues.

Dear Madam,

It is my pleasure to write to you on behalf of the Board and Members of Royal Life Saving Society – Australia on the occasion of your Platinum Jubilee. As Patron of the Royal Life Saving Society, your dedication to water safety and prevention of drowning across the Commonwealth has been tireless and we thank you for your commitment and service.

We consider ourselves fortunate to be part of the larger Royal Life Saving Society Commonwealth organisation and to be able to contribute to drowning prevention efforts in low- and middle-income countries. We remain grateful for your support, and for making time to meet with some of our dedicated volunteers on the occasion of the 125th year of the Royal Life Saving Society – Australia in 2019.

As one of the oldest not-for-profit organisations in Australia, we continue to serve our community with the same vision that our founders set – that drowning is preventable and we continue to work towards a nation free from drowning.

Regrettably, drowning continues to be a significant cause of death in Australia. Among the emerging challenges we must face is the impacts of a long period where water safety and swimming lessons could not be accessed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We led the development of the Australian Water Safety Strategy 2030, working with government and other drowning prevention stakeholders to design and implement strategies to reduce drowning across Australia. This includes prioritising under-served communities and driving research to inform evidence-based policy.

We are proud of the work that we do in communities right across Australia, including in geographically remote and Indigenous communities. As an example of our current work, the Talent Pool program in Western Australia offers Indigenous young people training and employment on country, with career paths that ensure local young people are equipped and empowered to participate in the local economy as paid professionals.

In April, Royal Life Saving Society – Australia released water safety information in written and audio formats for 11 additional multicultural communities in Australia, to ensure that fluency in English is not required to be able to enjoy our waterways safely.

The challenges of a large and diverse country, with countless bodies of water are many, but we are encouraged by your continuing interest in our work. Thank you for your exemplary service and leadership.



The Royal Life Saving Society – Malta Branch

The Royal Life Saving Society, Malta Branch was founded in 1924 most likely by the British Services at that time stationed on the island. This is further confirmed through the historical Shield which the Branch still presents to the organization/club with the highest number of awards gained during a particular year. The Shield started to be used in the early 1930s and the first names that appear on it are British army and navy units. For many years RLSS awards were mostly gained by British personel and the Malta Police. In the 1950s, St. Micheal's Training College for teachers (later renamed, St. Micheal's College of Education) run by the De La Salle Brothers was founded. The Brothers, great educators and experts in the formation of teachers in all social aspects, introduced RLSS awards to the training teachers. Through later teachers, the Branch was opened to the Maltese society in general. Since then, the Branch has been called to teach, besides individuals not affiliated to any organization, personnel from various institutions including the Armed Forces of Malta, the Malta Police, the Civil Protection Department, hotel staff, youth organizations, Girl Guides, Scouts and many others.

Your Majesty has always had a special attraction for Malta and lived on the island even when you were a princess. You have made various State visits but for the Branch one of the most memorable landmarks in its history is when in 1992, when on your State visit to Malta to inargurate the Siege Bell Momorial in Valletta to commorate Malta's important part in WW11, the Branch was invited to meet you. It was a great honour for the Malta Branch and the individuals present on that occasion. A day never that will surely never be forgotten!
